Registration

Registration for this event is an online submission and must be completed in full in order for the entry to be accepted.

Qualification for Entry:

Competitors who competed in any part of the 2015 Skate Canada Central Ontario Sectional Championships (in November 2014) may not enter the same discipline at Club Competition; **however,** they **may enter in any other discipline (category)**

Test Prerequisites: February 1 preceding the competition.

Age Requirements : July 1, 2014

Skating up: Skaters may skate up in the Freeskate and Dance categories, if desired.

ENTRY FEES : Fees are payable by VISA or MasterCard or cheque.

Early Bird Entry Fees:

Registrations Received **ON** or **PRIOR** to **March 31 2015**

Category Fee is \$30.00

Registrations Received **AFTER** **March 31, 2015**

Category Fee is \$40.00

Registration will CLOSE on April 7, 2015.

A \$15.00 administration fee will be charged if changes to your entry are required

Late Entries may be accepted at the discretion of the committee and will be subject to a \$25.00 late fee

CATEGORIES

All freeskate categories will be judged using the 2014-2015 Skate Canada - Central Ontario Well Balanced Program (WBP) technical package posted at www.skatecanada-centralontario.com. Deductions will be taken for any elements outside of specifications in accordance with the WBP requirements.

The following categories will be held at the 2015 SMFSC – Club Competition:

Skaters are only permitted to enter ONE (1) Category.

STAR 1 – STAR 3 Categories: Elements scored to standard (Merit, Bronze, Silver or Gold)

STAR 1 Element Assessment

May not have passed any part of the Senior Bronze Free Skating Test (Geared to those who have not mastered more than three (3) single jumps).

Please refer to the STAR Pre-Event Technical Package posted on the Skate Canada Central Ontario Technical Page.

STAR 2 Compulsory Assessment Program

May not have passed any part of the Senior Bronze Free Skating Test. (Geared to skaters who have not yet mastered more than five (5) single jumps). Program Length: 1:00 or 1:30 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds) Vocal music is not permitted.

STAR 3 Free Skating Program

May not have passed any part of the Senior Bronze Free Skating Test. (Geared to skaters who have not yet mastered double jumps). Program Length: 1:30 or 2:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)

Vocal music is not permitted.

STAR 4 Free Skating Program

May not have passed any part of the Senior Bronze Free Skating Test. (Geared to skaters who have not yet mastered double jumps). Program Length: 1:30 or 2:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)

Vocal music is not permitted. Skaters will be grouped by age as follows: U10, U13, 13 and over .

Skaters will be awarded merit of bronze, silver and gold and will be ranked.

The following Categories will be scored on CPC

Junior Bronze Development

May have passed the complete Junior Bronze Freeskate test but no higher complete free skate test.

Program Length: 2.0 minutes (+/- 10 seconds)

Please refer to the 2014-2015 Skate Canada – Central Ontario WBP requirements

STAR 5 Free Skating Program

May not have passed any part of the Junior Silver Free Skating Test. (Geared to those skaters working on double jumps but not yet ready for Pre-Juvenile/Senior Bronze).

Program Length: 2:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds) Vocal music is not permitted.

Skaters will be grouped by age as follows: U10, U13, 13 and over.

Senior Bronze STARSkate

May have passed the complete Senior Bronze Freeskate test but no higher complete free skate test.

Program Length: 2.5 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) .

SOLO DANCE CATEGORIES

Description: Individual skaters perform the prescribed dance.
Music will be Skate Canada Series 8. Scored on CPC

Senior Bronze

May have passed the complete Senior Bronze Dance test but not the complete Junior Silver Dance test. Dances to be skated: Fourteen Step (3 sequences), Keats Foxtrot (3 sequences)

Junior Silver

May have passed the complete Junior Silver dance test but not the complete Senior silver Dance test. Dances to be skated: Rocker Foxtrot (3 sequences), Paso Doble (2 sequences)

Senior Silver

May have passed the complete Senior Silver Dance test but not the complete Gold Dance Test. Dances to be skated: Blues (2 sequences), Quickstep (3 sequences)

Gold

May have passed the complete Gold Dance test.
Dances to be skated: Viennese Waltz (2 sequences), Argentine Tango (2 sequences)

INTERPRETIVE CATEGORIES:

Interpretive programs should meet the requirements as outlined in the 2014-2015 Skate Canada Technical Pkg.

Pre-Introductory

Must not have passed any Skate Canada Interpretive Skating test.
Program Length: 2:00 Minutes maximum.

Introductory

Must have passed the Introductory Interpretive test but no higher.
Program Length: 2:00 Minutes maximum.

Bronze

Must have passed the Bronze Interpretive test but no higher.
Program Length: 3:00 Minutes maximum.

Silver

Must have passed the Silver Interpretive test but no higher.
Program Length: 3:00 Minutes maximum.

Gold

Must have passed the Gold Interpretive test.
Program Length: 3:00 Minutes maximum.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The competition will be held in accordance with the rules of Skate Canada and special guidelines approved for the competition

Eligibility Rules: This competition is open to registered 2014-2015 members with SMFSC

Entries will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. The committee reserves the right to limit entries in categories as necessary. In the case of a large entry in any category, the skaters will be drawn into groups. The committee reserves the right to cancel categories if so necessary.

No skater will be considered registered until all money owing is properly paid for by the final closing date of which time they registered.

Refunds and Withdrawals :

Full refunds will be given for any cancelled category.

If an entry needs to be withdrawn **due to a medical injury** (doctor's note must be provided) and is done so prior to April 21, 2015, a refund (less an administrative fee of \$15.00/skater) will be granted.

NOTE: NO REFUNDS (including medical) will be granted **after** April 21, 2015

Confirmation of Entry: Competition schedule and entry list will be posted Website

Competitors must register at least one hour before the scheduled time of their category. Categories may commence up to 15 minutes before their scheduled time.

While every attempt has been made to ensure that the information in this announcement is correct, changes may be required. We advise coaches, parents, and skaters to check the SMFSC website for any CHANGES OR UPDATES leading up to the competition.

Officials: Judging panels will be assigned by the COS Technical Representative for the competition. Non Skate Canada judges may be used at the discretion of the Technical Representative.

Marking System: Skate to Standard for STAR 1 – STAR 4
The Cumulative Points System (CPC) for STAR 5, Jr. Bronze Dev, Sr. Bronze,
Solo Dance & Interpretive

Awards:

Ribbons and certificates will be presented to all participants in the STAR 1 – 3 categories.

Medals will be presented to skaters finishing first, second and third in each of the following categories: STAR 4, Jr. Bronze Development, STAR 5, Sr. Bronze, Solo Dance and Interpretive

Single Entries: Categories with only one entry **may** have the option of skating an exhibition or skating in a higher category if it is available. The decision is to be made by the committee based on availability of the ice time. Medals will be awarded for exhibition skates.

2014 – 2015 SKATE CANADA - CENTRAL ONTARIO CODE OF CONDUCT APPLICATION

This Code of Conduct and any rules made pursuant hereto shall apply to any skater participating in any competition, carnival, exhibition or program held within or sponsored, in whole or in part, by COS

PUBLICATION

This Code of Conduct has been adopted by the Board of Directors of Skate Canada – Central Ontario and any amendments hereto, any rules made from time to time pursuant hereto or by way of explanation hereof shall be determined and adopted by such Board of Directors and shall be made known to all member clubs of Skate Canada – Central Ontario by the mailing of a copy of this Code of Conduct or any amendments, rules or explanations to each of such member clubs within the Section. Further, any skater participating in any program or competition of Skate Canada – Central Ontario shall be required to acknowledge receipt of a copy hereof and to agree in writing prior to such participation to be bound by this Code of Conduct.

RULES

While participating in any competition, carnival, exhibition or program as a figure skater, such skater: •shall not possess, use or supply to others any alcohol, narcotics or unprescribed drugs while at, within or near the site of such competition, carnival, exhibition or program or any residence or other accommodations provided in connection therewith or while in the course of being transported to or from such locations; •shall not conduct himself or herself in an unreasonable or unacceptable manner (which for clarity shall mean and include unsportsmanlike conduct, breaking training or curfew, willfully damaging property or committing any act which is considered an offence under any duly promulgated law); and •shall not be in breach of any rules of conduct promulgated by Skate Canada.

PENALTIES

Any damage to property shall be paid for by the skater causing same. In addition to any action which may be taken immediately by the Skate Canada – Central Ontario official in charge at the time, the skater shall be subject to being sent home at the skater's expense and shall be required to reimburse any costs involved in the skater's participation in the event concerned and shall not receive any further financial assistance from Skate Canada – Central Ontario.

APPEALS

If a skater wishes to appeal any personal application of this Code of Conduct, such skater shall submit a written appeal to the Chairman of Skate Canada – Central Ontario within five days of the occurrence giving rise to the application. Such appeal will be immediately investigated, a hearing shall be given to the skater and any decision thereon shall be binding upon the skater.

ACCIDENT AND PUBLICITY WAIVER

It is understood and agreed that Skate Canada - Central Ontario shall not be liable for injury or loss occasioned by the athlete while travelling to or from or during the Skate Canada – Central Ontario Competition, nor shall Skate Canada - Central Ontario be responsible for any damages or losses caused by the athlete during the same time. The athlete and/or athlete's parent(s)/legal guardian agree to indemnify Skate Canada - Central Ontario and hold them harmless from any claims or demands in respect of such loss or damage.

The competitor hereby acknowledges and consents to the fact that the Skate Canada – Central Ontario Competition will be videotaped either in whole or in part. The competitor hereby consents to the use of his/her name, biography and likeness on or in connection with any television or radio program, motion picture or still pictures, video, new media, Internet, web, print media or the advertising and publicizing of such program as may be designated by Skate Canada - Central Ontario and waives all rights to remuneration or otherwise in connection with the above. The foregoing is subject to assurance that the eligibility of the competitor will be fully protected by Skate Canada.
