## Bingo Report (Lisa L.)

A team of volunteer bona fide members attend bingo sessions at the Delta Mississauga bingo hall as a fundraising activity. Starting in July 2023, we expanded our volunteer list to 10 members who take turns attending sessions in 2 person teams. The bingo association assigns us bingo sessions to attend throughout the year, approximately 3 per month, although the number per month varies usually between 2-5 sessions.

All charities and non-profit/not for profit organizations that attend these sessions participate in the conduct of the bingos and receive a share of the proceeds for all the sessions attended. These proceeds are deposited into a separate bingo bank account and when sufficient funds have accumulated the funds are used to pay for a month of ice time. During the past year our club has fundraised more than \$23,000 from the bingo activity and paid for 2 months of ice time from the bingo account.

#### CanSkate Report (Karen H.)

Report presented by MP because Karen at CanSkate.

The 2022 - 2023 CanSkate season was our first full season of our learn to skate program since the start of COVID.

All three sessions were at capacity from the start with waitlists that we couldn't clear.

We had a few changes to our sessions in 2022 2023, our on-ice admin coach put together a program that would be tested by Skate Canada to ensure we were meeting their standards in the CanSkate excellence program. The evaluator who saw the program gave us the exceeded standard which showed that once again we provided our skaters the best learn to skate program.

This also meant that by these standards, we could only have 50 skaters on the ice for each session, we were used to pushing that to 60 in years prior to COVID.

Our coaching team works hard to offer a quality program, we have our core full time coaches and working alongside them are 5 coaches who come in solely to teach CanSkate. In the spring of 2023, we added two more of our skaters to our coaching staff and they will work this coming season with our professional coaches to become certified by Skate Canada.

We continue to engage our 12-year-old skaters to get involved as Program Assistants while we have some very keen 10+ year old's who love to come and help. This opportunity will not only help them earn points for their parents to help pay for some skating expenses, it also will help when they get to high school to earn them volunteer time that is required to finish high school. Overall, our CanSkaters showed plenty of progress, earning stickers, badges and ribbons for their efforts.

The administration team of Karen Hornsby & Leslie Baker continue to work together on the CanSkate sessions, their organization and efficient running of each session is part of the reason for its success. Always being available for parents to ask questions is great customer service for our newest members.

Thank you to the SMFSC coaching staff for providing top notch instruction to our CanSkaters inspiring them to continue in their skating and enter into the StarSkate program.

## Competition Report (Lisa L.)

In the 2022-2023 our skaters saw the first uninterrupted competition season since the 2018-2019 season.

Skate Ontario continued to offer skaters the opportunity to pick a preferred competition in each competition block, ensuring that skaters get a chance to compete by sending them an advance registration link for 1 competition in each block.

Our club results are listed below by competition categories:

Sectional Series: We did not have any skaters in the Sectional Series this season.

Super Series (STAR 5 - Gold): We had 21 skaters register for events in the Super Series. This was up from 17 skaters in the previous season.

As a result of their performance in Super Series events, we had 11 invitations to the Provincial Championships. Congratulations to these 8 skaters.

*STAR 1 – 4 Competitions*: We had 41 skaters register for events in the STAR 1-4 categories. This was an increase from 28 skaters in the previous season. STAR 1-3 skaters are assessed against a standard and receive a report card with a level achieved against these standards (Gold, Silver, Bronze). STAR 4 skaters achieve a ranking in this series, but not yet a numerical score. Results for these competitions are not tracked here as results are not posted.

**Adult Competitions:** We had 2 skaters register for adult events this season, up from 1 in the previous season.

Assessment Report (Lisa G.)

#### Star 1 to Gold Assessment

The STAR 1 to Gold program encourages long-term athlete development and the tenets of skating for life. Our SMFSC coaches are all qualified by Skate Canada to "assess" their own skaters

for possible progression to the next level within the STAR 1-5 programs. During weekly skating sessions, skaters were assessed by their base coaches during lesson time when their coach deemed it the right time for that skater. Skater and parent(s) were notified in advance and a fee of \$15 per assessment was paid online. Skaters then submitted this ticket to the base coach, who submitted the assessment ticket and the top portion of the assessment sheet to the assessment coordinator for data entry and record keeping.

Skaters who are working on Star 6 to Gold assessments are evaluated by a Skate Canada Assessor on a designated date and time that is called assessment days. This year the assessment dates were held on: October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022, December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022, March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023, June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023, and August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2023. The fee to be assessed for the first Star 6 to Gold Assessment is \$25 and \$15 for each additional assessment. The procedure for Designated Star 6 to Gold Assessment days requires skaters to purchase tickets online at our SMFSC website under the tab titled Star 1-Gold Program Assessments and then print off their assessment ticket or download it to a device for viewing so it can be scanned at the check-in counter.

SMFSC skaters were very successful this season as indicated below in our Program Assessment Table. Thanks to the SMFSC coaching staff who helped the skaters realize their potential both on and off the ice.
