## Bingo Report (Lisa L.)

A team of 10 super volunteers take turns attending bingo sessions in teams of 2, at the Delta Mississauga bingo hall as a fundraising activity. The bingo association assigns us bingo sessions to attend throughout the year, approximately 3 per month, although the number per month varies usually between 3 – 5 sessions. All charities and non-profit/not for profit organizations that attend these sessions participate in the conduct of the bingos and receive a share of the proceeds for all the sessions based on the number of sessions attended. These proceeds are deposited into a separate bingo bank account and when sufficient funds have accumulated the funds are used to pay for a month of ice time. During the past year our club has fundraised more than \$28,000 from the bingo activity and paid for 2 months of ice time from the bingo account.

## CanSkate Report (Karen H.)

The 2023 2024 CanSkate season saw our fall programs struggle a little in getting to our max skaters mostly due to the wonderful warm weather we experienced for the first two months of the fall and skaters going back to school. Our winter classes were pretty well attended, and spring was surprisingly well attended, summer was about 50% capacity.

We continue to work on the CanSkate excellence program directive as we strive to offer the best learn to skate experience in the city.

Our coaching team works hard to offer a quality program, we had our core 4 full time coaches, 2 part time coaches and working alongside them are 5 coaches who come in a few days a week solely to teach CanSkate. Fall of 2024 we have one more of our StarSkaters added to our CanSkate coaching staff and working alongside our professional coaches to become CanSkate Certified by Skate Canada.

We continue to engage our 12-year-old StarSkaters to get involved as Program Assistants while we have some very keen 10+ year old StarSkaters who love to come and help, working their way up to the Program Assistant role. This opportunity will not only help them earn points for their parents to help pay for some skating expenses, it also will help when they get to high school to earn the community volunteer hours required to graduate from high school.

Overall, our CanSkaters showed plenty of progress, earning stickers, badges and ribbons for their efforts and many made the move into our PreStar program to begin their figure skating aspirations.

The administration team of Karen Hornsby & Leslie Baker work together on the Canskate sessions, their organization and efficient running of each session is part of the reason for its success. Always being available for parents to ask questions is great customer service for our newest members.

Thank you to the SMSC coaching staff for providing top notch instruction to our CanSkaters inspiring them to continue in their skating and continue in other skating sports as well enter the StarSkate program with SMSC.

# Competition Report (Lisa L.)

#### **Sectional Series:**

We did not have any skaters in the Sectional Series this season.

#### **Provincial Series (STAR 5 – Gold):**

We had 26 skaters register for events in the Provincial Series this season (last season -21, previous season -17)

Skaters in this series registered for competitions in Kitchener-Waterloo (Aug), Keswick (Nov), Stratford (Dec), Milton (Jan), Brampton (Feb), and Brantford (Feb).

We had a total of 122 registrations at these competitions with 21 (17.2%) winning medals and 57 (46.7%) scoring a personal best score.

Based on scores in these competitions we had 9 entries in the Provincial Championships in Brampton with 2 (22.2%) winning medals and scoring a personal best score at the championships.

In addition, we had 14 skaters represent our club at a competition in Buffalo N.Y.

#### STAR 1-4 Series:

We had 63 skaters register for events at this level (last season – 41, previous season – 28). Skaters in this series registered for competitions in Keswick (Nov), Stratford (Dec), Mississauga (Feb), Newmarket (March), Bring on the Fun Milton (May), and a Club Exhibition in June.

#### **Adult Series:**

We had 4 skaters register for events in this series (last season -2, previous season -1) Our adults skated in Stratford (entries-5, medals-3 (60%), personal best scores-3 (60%)), and at the Provincial Adult Championships (entries-3, medals-1 (33.3%)), and 1 skater represented our club at 2 international competitions.

## Assessment Report (Lisa G.)

#### Star 1 to Gold Assessment

The STAR 1 to Gold program encourages long-term athlete development and the tenets of skating for life. Our SMSC coaches **are all qualified by Skate Canada** to "assess" their skaters for possible progression to the next level within the STAR 1-5 programs. During weekly skating sessions, skaters were assessed by their base coaches during lesson time when their coach deemed it the right time for that skater. Skater and parent(s) were notified in advance and a fee of \$15 per assessment was paid online. Skaters then submitted this ticket to the base coach, who submitted the assessment ticket and the top portion of the assessment sheet to the assessment coordinator for data entry and record keeping.

A Skate Canada Assessor evaluates skaters working on Star 6 to Gold assessments on a designated date and time called assessment days. This year the assessment dates were held on: November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023, March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024, June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024, and August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024. The fee to be assessed for the first Star 6 to Gold Assessment is \$25 and \$15 for each additional assessment.

As indicated in our Program Assessment Table, SMSC skaters were very successful this season. Thanks to the SMSC coaching staff who helped the skaters realize their potential both on and off the ice.

## Off-Ice Report

(Information not formally discussed at meeting but made available to our members.)

Our off-ice training programs continue to play a critical role in the development of our skaters from Pre-star to Gold and are designed to complement on-ice training. These programs run from

September through end of May during the regular season, with additional sessions offered in July and August for summer training. Programs include:

- 1. Jump enhance jump technique, coordination, and strength for better on-ice performance.
- 2. Dance improve artistic expression, rhythm, and grace.
- 3. Stretch & Flexibility boost core strength, stamina, and flexibility, reducing injury risk and increasing movement range.
- 4. Mental Health Workshops introduced during the summer, these sessions help skaters manage stress and focus, preparing them for competitions.
- 5. Yoga added this year to promote mindfulness, body awareness, and flexibility, supporting both physical and mental well being.

Out off-ice programs are a vital part of our training ecosystem, contributing to the holistic development of our skaters. We continuously assess and adjust these programs as needed to ensure they meet the evolving needs of our skaters, helping them stay confident, strong and competition ready year-round.
