Arena Rental Rates

The arena ice rental rates paid by the club during the 2024-2025 season* correspond to the category “Affiliate Sport Providers and Mississauga-based PDSB/DPCDSB School Boards”.

Fall/Winter/Spring Rentals (September 1, 2023 – April 30, 2024)

Prime Time: \$ 204.25

Non-Prime Time: \$ 122.75

Summer Ice Rentals (May 1, 2024 – August 31, 2024)

Prime Time: \$ 210.35

Non-Prime Time: \$ 126.40

Bingo Report (Lisa L.)

A team of 10 super volunteers take turns attending bingo sessions in teams of 2, at the Delta Mississauga bingo hall as a fundraising activity. The bingo association assigns us bingo sessions to attend throughout the year, approximately 3 per month, although the number per month varies usually between 3 – 5 sessions. All charities and non-profit/not for profit organizations that attend these sessions participate in the conduct of the bingos and receive a share of the proceeds for all the sessions based on the number of sessions attended. These proceeds are deposited into a separate bingo bank account and when sufficient funds have accumulated the funds are used to pay for a month of ice time. During the past year our club has fundraised more than \$26,000 from the bingo activity and paid for 2 months of ice time from the bingo account.

CanSkate Report (Karen H.)

The 2024 2025 CanSkate season was successful, but we did struggle to get going in the fall which seems to be a typical scenario mostly due to the wonderful warm weather we experience in September and October and skaters going back to school. Our winter classes were very well attended, and spring was surprisingly well attended with a small change due to the date of our Ice show changing. Summer was about 75% capacity with two classes (smaller numbers allowed on each session) being run on both weeks.

We continue to work on the CanSkate excellence program directive as we strive to offer the best learn to skate experience in the city.

Our coaching team works hard to offer a quality program, we had our core full time coaches as well as a good supply of part time and CanSkate only coaches. Fall of 2025 we have 3 more of our StarSkaters added to our CanSkate coaching staff and working alongside our professional coaches to become CanSkate Certified by Skate Canada.

We continue to engage our 12-year-old StarSkaters to get involved as Program Assistants while we have some very keen 10+ year old StarSkaters who love to come and help, working their way

up to the Program Assistant role. This opportunity will not only help them earn points for their parents to help pay for some skating expenses, it also will help when they get to high school to earn the community volunteer hours required to graduate from high school.

Overall, our CanSkaters showed plenty of progress, earning stickers, badges and ribbons for their efforts and many made the move into our PreStar/Star 1 program to begin their figure skating aspirations.

The administration team of Karen Hornsby & Leslie Baker with the addition of Lisa Kaspari on Saturdays, work together on the CanSkate sessions, their organization and efficient running of each session is part of the reason for its success. Always being available for parents to ask questions is great customer service for our newest members.

Thank you to the SMFSC coaching staff for providing top notch instruction to our CanSkaters inspiring them to continue skating!

Competition Report (Lisa L.)

Sectional Series:

We had 2 skaters registered in categories in Sectional competitions this season. They competed in 3 Sectional Competitions, total registrations 4, personal best scores 4 (100%), medals earned 1 (25%).

Provincial Series (STAR 5 – Gold):

We had 25 skaters register for events in the Provincial Series this season.

Skaters in this series registered for competitions in Kitchener-Waterloo (Aug), Keswick (Nov), Sudbury (Nov), Stratford (Dec), Milton (Jan), and Brampton (Feb).

We had a total of 153 registrations at these competitions with 42 (27.5%) winning medals and 62 (40.5%) scoring a personal best score.

Based on scores in these competitions we earned 16 entries in the Provincial Championships with 3 (18.8%) winning medals and 3 (18.8%) scoring a personal best score at the championships.

STAR 1- 4 Series:

We had 65 skaters register for events at this level.

Skaters in this series registered for competitions in Brampton (Nov), Leaside and Brant (Jan), Milton (Mar), and Niagara (Apr).

Skaters at this level are scored against a standard, not each other.

Adult Series:

We had 4 skaters register for events in this series

Our adults skated in Erin and the Adult Provincials. Total Entries – 8, earning 5 medals (62.5%), and 5 (62.5%) personal best scores.

Assessment Report (Lisa G.)

Star1 to Gold Assessment

The STAR 1 to Gold program encourages long-term athlete development and the principles of skating for life. Our SMFSC coaches are all certified by Skate Canada to evaluate their skaters for potential advancement to the next level within the STAR 1–5 program. During weekly skating sessions, skaters are assessed by their base coaches during lessons when the coach deems it appropriate for that skater. Skaters and parents are notified beforehand, and a fee of \$15 per assessment is paid online which is subsequently paid to Skate Canada. Skaters then submit this ticket to their base coach, who forwards both the assessment ticket and the top part of the assessment sheet to the assessment coordinator for data entry and record keeping.

A Skate Canada Assessor evaluates skaters working towards Star 6 to Gold assessments on designated assessment days. This year, the assessment dates were November 7th, 2024; March 5th, 2025; June 5th, 2025; and August 13th, 2025. The fee for the first Star 6 to Gold assessment is \$25, with an additional \$15 for each subsequent assessment.

As our Program Assessment Table shows, SMFSC skaters had a very successful season. Thanks to the SMFSC coaching staff, who helped the skaters realize their potential both on and off the ice.

Off-Ice Report (Karen T.)

(Information not formally discussed at meeting but made available to our members.)

Our off-ice training programs continue to play a critical role in the development of our skaters from Pre-star to Gold and are designed to complement on-ice training. These programs run from September through end of May during the regular season, with additional sessions offered in July and August for summer training. Programs include:

1. Jump – enhance jump technique, coordination, and strength for better on-ice performance. To ensure all skaters had the opportunity to participate, especially since classes filled quickly, we expanded the program this season by adding a couple of additional jump sessions on a second evening.
2. Dance – improve artistic expression, rhythm, and movement quality. We also introduced an additional evening dance session this season in response to increased interest from our skaters.
3. Cardio, Stretch & Flexibility – boost core strength, stamina, and flexibility, reducing injury risk and increasing movement range.

Our off-ice programs are a vital part of our training ecosystem, contributing to the holistic development of our skaters. We continuously assess and adjust these programs as needed to ensure they meet the evolving needs of our skaters, helping them stay confident, strong and competition ready year-round.
