Welcome/President's Report (MP)

Welcome to our 2021/2022 AGM.

We had a year to get our Skaters, Coaches and Board Members working to get the Club up and running and heading back to some normalcy.

As time went on, we accepted what we had to do to keep ourselves safe and healthy and were able to offer programs, so that our Skaters could be with their friends, test their skills, dances and go to available competitions. For Fall 2022 we have continued to keep our members safe as well as being able to have affordable programs.

Fall programs have begun and hopefully things will continue on a positive note to increase program numbers and help the club increase our membership.

STARSkate, Adult Learn to skate, off-ice classes and our CanSkate programs are available and numbers seem to be increasing each day.

Retention of skaters is still our focus, and the Board of Directors will continue to make that a priority.

We have hired some new staff to assist, our base Coaches. We are still offering 4 Assessment Days this season to help our Skaters move forward.

The Club is looking at having an Ice Show in 2023, pending no further outbreaks or closures. That information will be shared when details and registration are finalized.

To all the coaches, board members and our Administrator, their support this past year and going into the 2022-2023 will help keep the Club in a positive financial position to go forward.

Communications (MP)

All club news is typically communicated to our members via email, website updates, and postings on the notice boards at Meadowvale 4 Rinks in Rink 3. We have regular office hours during the regular season which are also posted in Rink 3. In addition, email inquiries are answered by our club administrator typically within 2 days or less.

The NEW rates began in Sept 2021. We always submitt our Fall/Winter/Spring ice requests at once so that our season is not disrupted. Summer is done separately as the arenas kept open each Summer can vary because of Capital Rennovations.									

Bingo Report (Lisa L.)

Due to the COVID 19 pandemic restrictions, in person bingos had been shut down since March 2020. An online bingo game was started during the previous year, and this continued until August of 2021, when the bingo hall started opening up in a limited way, starting with only 1 session per day on weekends only, and have been cautiously adding sessions and days of the week ever since with the exception of January 2022 when they were required, due to provincial restrictions to close.

In previous years, we were required to provide a team of at least 3 bonafide volunteers for 2 bingos per month (some months having up to 4 sessions per month.) With a new format, from August 2021, we are now required to provide only 1 volunteer per session, as the bingo hall is now responsible for much of duties that our volunteers used to provide. We currently have 2 bonafide members who have been taking turns at these events at the Delta Bingo Hall on either Saturdays or Sundays as the events are assigned to us.

During this time of restart-up the bingo association has suspended the payment of licensing fees per bingo session, until summer of 2022 when the fees were reinstated due to the bingo's being better attended and more profitable.

All charities and non-profit organizations that participate in the conduct of bingo's receive a share of the proceeds of all the sessions held each month, based on how many sessions they attend. These proceeds are deposited into a separate Bingo account and when sufficient has accumulated the funds are used to pay for a month of ice time. During the past year our club has fundraised approximately \$10,000 from this fundraising activity.

CanSkate Report (Karen)(Read by MP)

Our CanSkate 2021 2022 season started out slow with lower numbers on our sessions but ended strong considering what we expected could be full of starts and stops.

We introduced the PreCanSkate program for 4-6 year old skaters on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and Saturday mornings. This was to allow for more skaters getting back on the ice and with its 30-minute format, it proved to be very popular for the younger new skaters.

Our fall session numbers were low (typically fall is lower at the beginning but grows as the months move into colder weather) but with the restrictions we had to keep the session numbers low but they all did get to capacity.

Winter session numbers were steady but once the requirements to enter the arena were lifted, we saw an increase in the Spring numbers and we could see that some sort of normal was back.

Summer CanSkate was popular, both weeks were at 90% and 92% of capacity.

This season we are starting with great numbers. We have decided to keep the PreCanSkate program for 4-year-olds and only run them on Tuesdays and Thursdays, they are currently at 75% capacity. The CanSkate programs on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturday for fall 2022 are all at least 95% capacity.

Once of the problems we are having is coaching, seems that is a universal problem these days, more coaches would allow us to increase our numbers closer to what we were running in the past. Program Assistants are also a vital part of the program so ensuring that the CanSkate sessions back onto sessions where our skaters are skating is important for its success.

Competition Report (Lisa LeClair)

The 2021-2022 season saw a return to competitions since the cancellation of the March 2020 Provincials and all subsequent competitions due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Skate Ontario continued to make improvements to the registration process from the 2019-2020 season by offering skaters in the GTA to pick a preferred competition in both January and February/March and then receive an advance registration link to ensure that all skaters had a

chance to register for at least one competition in each block. All skaters could then register for any remaining spots after advance registration dates had passed.

Due to another shutdown, all competitions for the month of January were cancelled, and the Brampton competition for early February allowed skaters to withdraw due to lack of time to train, this resulted in less registrations in this event. Skate Ontario did schedule a replacement competition for the Super Series event in Milton, however the STAR 1-4 competition planned for January was not rescheduled.

Super Series (STAR 5 – Gold): We had 17 skaters register for events in the Super Series, including 1 adult skater. (Scarboro Fun Skate is not included here as there were no individual results provided for this competition)

As a result of their performance in Super Series events, we had 15 invitations to the Provincial Championships. Congratulations to these 12 skaters.

STAR 1 – 4 Competitions: We had 28 skaters register for events in the STAR 1-4 categories. STAR 1-3 skaters are assessed against a standard and receive a report card with a level achieved against these standards (Gold, Silver, Bronze). STAR 4 skaters achieve a ranking in this series, but not yet a numerical score. Results for these competitions are not tracked here as results are not posted. *This year in the STAR 1-4 competitions, we had 15 skaters who competed in their very first competition.*

Scarboro Fun Skate: This year for the first time, Scarboro hosted a fun competition that included all categories of skaters for both STAR 1-4 and Super Series categories. No individual scores or placements were announced at this competition. All placements were assigned points

and the total points for each club were tracked on a large chart on the wall at the competition. SMSC scored a total of 309 team points and finished 6th out of all the teams participating at the competition. We had 39 skaters participate in 46 registrations, which included team events at all levels, with skaters participating a total of 68 times, counting each team member.

Assessment Report (Lisa G.)

The STAR 1 to Gold program encourages long-term athlete development and the tenets of skating for life. Our SMFSC coaches are all qualified by Skate Canada to "assess" their own skaters for possible progression to the next level within the STAR 1 - 5 program. During weekly skating sessions, skaters were assessed by their base coaches during lesson time when their coach deemed it the right time for that skater. Skater and parent(s) were notified in advance and a fee of \$15 per assessment was paid online. Skaters then submitted this ticket to the base coach who in turn submitted the assessment ticket and top portion of the assessment sheet to the assessment coordinator for data entry and record keeping.

Skaters who are working on Star 6 to Gold assessments are evaluated by a Skate Canada Assessor on a designated date and time that is called assessment days. This year the assessment dates were held on: October 5th, 2021, December 2nd, 2021, March 8th, 2022, May 31st, 2022, and August 18th, 2022. SMSC added an extra assessment day this year to provide skaters with an opportunity to catch up due to the number of assessment day cancellations in the past because of the COVID-19 Pandemic. The fee to be assessed for the first Star 6 to Gold Assessment is \$25 and \$15 for each additional assessment. The procedure for Designated Star 6 to Gold Assessment days requires skaters to purchase tickets online at our SMSC website under the tab titled Star 1-Gold Program Assessments and then print off their assessment ticket or download it to a device for viewing so it can be scanned at the check-in counter.

To close, SMFSC skaters were very successful this season as indicated below in our Program Assessment Table. Thanks to the SMSC coaching staff who helped the skaters realize their potential both on and off the ice.

Off-Ice Report (Sherry P.)(Read by MP)

For the 2021/2022 skating season SMFSC was able to continue the off-ice Programs in person at the off- ice room. With the input from the coaches who best understand what the skaters need for their off-ice training, we chose to keep the same programs and were able to put two off ice programs on Wednesday due to the high demand.

Those Programs being, Core Balance by Rachel Cates on Mondays, Dance and Body Movement by Jenny Pullon on Tuesdays, Active Flexibility by Ally Hornsby, and Jump Class by Susan Richie on Wednesday. Strength and Conditioning by Stephanie Hansuld was held on Thursdays.

We always try to ensure a well-rounded training regiment, and a schedule that will fit our skaters over all training, and at the same time accommodating their on-ice time to save parents travel time. We tried to keep all the Programs active, but unfortunately, we had to cancel one class, Strength and Conditioning on Thursday due to low enrollment.

We strongly encourage our skaters to take the off-ice classes in an effort to properly supplement their on-ice training, and we have offered packages including on ice/off ice classes. In addition, we are always open to new programs and looking to find new ways of providing additional classes, training, and new instructors to enrich the off-ice programs.
